We are offering a daytime and evening session so all our members have the opportunity to take part!





Do you love Science? Join us at Culford School for a day of science where you will be welcomed with complimentary tea or coffee before taking your seat to hear from our scientific experts.

Professor Matthew Bothwell from The Department of Astronomy, Cambridge received his PhD from the University of Cambridge and has worked as a postdoctoral researcher at Steward Observatory, University of Arizona. Matthew loves explaining the mysteries of the Universe and beyond. What do you want to know about Astronomy, come and ask Matthew and find out the answer. Morwenna Degnan has been a qualified Biomedical Scientist for 20 years. After leaving Culford School, she studied Biomedicine at The University of Hull. Morwenna has worked in many NHS hospitals including Addenbrookes and currently manages three labs in Gloucestershire.

She is qualified in Haematology and Clinical Biochemistry and has also worked as a stem cell scientist. If you want to know how Biomedicine fits in the world of medicine this is the talk for you.

Then, after a delicious buffet lunch we will settle back down to listen to Alison from The Whipple Museum, Cambridge. The museum is part of The

Department of Philosophy and History of Science. Donated by Robert Whipple in 1944 the museums collection includes scientific instruments and apparatus from the 17th-19th century plus models, photographs, books and other materials related to the history of science. Let Alison tell you more about the history and the founding of this fascinating museum. She will also bring along some exhibits for you to look at and handle.

# Faith & Feminism

Discover the fascinating origins of the Coptic Orthodox Church followed by a trip to Knebworth House to learn about the five centuries of remarkable women, including Suffragettes, associated with the Lytton family's ownership.

Coach pick up points include: Sudbury 8am, Bury St Edmunds 8.30am and Newmarket 9am.

Anticipated arrival at the Coptic church is 10.30am. Refreshments will be provided on arrival. The Coptic Orthodox Church, founded in the first century in Egypt, is one of the most ancient Churches in the world. Tucked away in the midst of the peaceful greenery of Shephalbury Park, a magnificent Gothic manor house is now part of The Coptic Orthodox Church Centre in the UK. The tour includes the history of the Christian Coptic faith, the location and its links with other faiths and community groups, followed by a Q&A. There is also an opportunity to visit to the magnificent Cathedral of St George.

After the tour (approx. 12.15pm) you will hop back on the coach to **Knebworth House** for **the Lutton Ladies tour**, arriving in time to for lunch which can be purchased on site or you can bring your own.

The Lutton Ladies tour will start at 2pm and will tell the stories of fascinating characters such as Mrs Bulwer Lytton who remodelled the house in the early 19th century; Rosina, who refused to act the meek Victorian wife after the break-up of her marriage to eminent author Sir Edward Bulwer Lytton; the militant suffragette Lady Constance Lytton, who disguised her identity to fight for the cause of Votes for Women, and Lady Pamela Lytton, Winston Churchill's first love.

There will be some extra time for exploring after the tour. The coach will depart for Suffolk at 4.30pm.
