Join The Whole Story October MP Lobby

There are less than 30 days to go until COP26- the world's 'last best chance' to limit the worst effects of global warming and keep global temperatures to 1.5C.



As a member of the largest women's voluntary organisation in England, Wales and the Islands, you and your fellow WI members have the power to be extremely influential in the run-up to COP26 by meeting with your MP during October.

Meeting with your MP will show that you, as an individual or group in their constituency, care about the outcomes of COP26 and that you expect strong climate agreements to be delivered that act decisively to limit the worst effects of climate change, especially for the most climate-vulnerable people and places in the world.

The worsening impacts of climate change will eventually affect every person and place on the planet. However, women and girls are more vulnerable to the effects of climate change.

You can hold your meeting with your MP any time during the month of October that will work for you and your MP. Your meeting could also be an opportunity for you to present your MP with a hand-crafted 'No More Loopholes' bracelet from you and your WI.

We have produced the below resources for you to use during your meeting with

your MP. From the 5th October, a recorded training session with climate communicators 'Hope For the Future' will also be available to access on MyWI.

Have your say in the restoration of Parliament!

As a part of the Houses of Parliament Restoration and Renewal programme, the NFWI has been asked to hold a Community Conversation focus group to feed into the process.



This is an excellent opportunity for WI members to inform plans for the restoration and renewal of the Houses of Parliament. You can take part even if you haven't been to or have a relationship to the building.

In a small group discussion you will explore questions such as what you think about the building's different roles and how to make it feel welcoming to diverse communities, as well as accessibility and facilities.

Anonymous feedback from the session as a whole will then be reported to the R&R Programme.

This small focus group will be held via Zoom on **26 October between 1 and 3pm** and all WI members are encouraged to apply.

Take part in our craftivism competition to raise awareness of the signs of ovarian cancer

To enter, members are invited to make something that represents the WI's ovarian cancer campaign, and will help to spread awareness of the key signs to look out for.

There are no restrictions on the type of medium or materials you can use, but

try to upcycle what you already have where you can. Entries will be judged by Nicky Amos, Chair of the NFWI Public Affairs Committee, and Gemma Hodgkiss, Communications Manager at gynae-oncology research charity GRACE.

The judges will consider the creativity of each entry and how well it communicates the key messages of the resolution.

The winning submission will be featured in a spring 2022 issue of *WI Life*, and across our social media channels. There will also be an online exhibition of submissions. This competition is open to all WI members. You can submit an entry as an individual, on behalf of your WI or federation, or together with your local community.

Please submit a photo of your entry to the NFWI Public Affairs Department **by email** or by post. You do not need to send the actual project. We would love to hear the story behind your artwork as well. Let us know what inspired you to create it, and the process you undertook to complete it.

The deadline for submissions is 31st January 2022.



5 Minutes that Matter – New campaign resource

Since 2019, the WI has been campaigning to raise awareness of the importance of cervical screening through our 5 Minutes that Matter campaign and, in April 2021, we published the findings of our research with nearly 3,000 women. As part of this research, we asked about HPV (human papillomavirus); how comfortable women feel about talking about it, and around how HPV can be passed on. We found that there are many misconceptions about HPV and

that women can feel confused, worried or embarrassed about it.

We want to help change this so, with the support of Jo's Cervical Cancer Trust and the Cancer Prevention Group at King's College London, we have produced a new leaflet which aims to help people understand HPV and their cervical screening results.
