## Chair's Chat

Unbelievably, my chat this month is about the **2024 Federation Annual Meeting (FAM)**.

In recent years FAM has had many changes, including venue. Many of us enjoyed The Apex, but as the number of members attending dropped it became too expensive to hire, so we moved to a smaller venue at Culford School. An outstanding venue, but as FAM's popularity began to grow again it soon became clear it was impractical with limitations on facilities, capacity, catering and increasing hire charges. With this in mind I decided we should look at larger cost effective venues.

Since June 2023, a team have been working alongside our Federation Secretary researching venues and comparing costs, facilities, catering and parking. I can now confirm our **2024 FAM** will be held at **Thurston Community College (TCC) on Thursday 11 April 2024.** I'm very excited about the new venue. TCC offers us better facilities, more seating and is cheaper to hire which will impact favourably on the ticket price! For 2024, we're offering a two tier ticket price with and without a catered lunchbox.

I know some of you have long memories and will remember our Autumn Council Meeting at TCC in 2017 when we were disappointed with the facilities, but I can reassure you since then it has had an extensive refurbishment!

So for, now save the date until tickets go on sale in the October issue of The Hive when we'll reveal the full details and our speakers!

### **SWFWI & the River Stour Trust**

We're very pleased to reveal that we'll be working with the **River Stour Trust** on their campaign for a designated bathing area between the Granary Cut in Sudbury and the Great Cornard Lock.

A designated bathing area will play a key role in tackling river pollution. It means water must be tested for bacteria and water companies will be obligated to tackle pollution in the area leading to the water quality improving for both people and wildlife. It goes hand in hand with The WI's latest Clean Rivers campaign.
