### Who we are and what we do

The National Federation of WIs (NFWI) is the largest women's organisation in the UK. It is non-sectarian and non-party political and as such is able to influence national and international affairs by becoming involved in campaigns for environment, education, health and other areas of particular concern to women.

WIs were started in Canada in 1897 by Adelaide Hoodless, a farmer's daughter, who wanted women in rural communities to support each other in their daily lives by learning new skills, taking part in social activities, to have fun and to make new friends. Although no longer confined to countrywomen, these aims are still relevant in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The first WI in Britain was established in Anglesey in 1915. ### 1954 Keep Britain Tidy

The WI resolution led to the formation of the Keep Britain Tidy group.



### 1972 Family Planning

The WI campaigned to establish the case for free contraception, irrespective of age or marital status.



### 1980s Aids Awareness

The WI was one of the first organisations to talk about AIDS and got the public talking about the issue.



#### 1990s Fairtrade

The WI joined with CAFOD, Christian Aid, Oxfam, Traidcraft and the World Development Movement and helped to form the Fairtrade Foundation.



### 2009 SOS Honeybees

WI members formed a network of 'bee ambassadors' raising awareness of the plight of the honey bee.



### 2017 End Plastic Soup

### **SWFWI Board of Trustees**

SWFWI is run by a Board of Trustees with sub committees delivering a wide range of events for all our members.

Up to fifteen volunteers are elected by Suffolk West WI members every two years to serve on the Board. Further members may be co-opted in throughout the year. The Chair, Treasurer and Vice Chairs are elected annually by the Board.



### **SWFWI Sub Committees**

Each sub committee represents a specialist area:

**Creative Leisure Activities** encourage the development of skills in craft and other art based activities.

**Events** are responsible for planning and running larger Federation events such as speaker lunches, educational seminars, coach trips and concerts.

Public Affairs keep members informed and educated on WI resolutions and campaigns. They also send a quarterly PA memo to members. Past issues are available on <a href="suffolk-west.thewi.org.uk">suffolk-west.thewi.org.uk</a>

**Promotion & Media** are responsible for publicising the WI, engaging new members and shaping the image of Suffolk West.

**Sports & Leisure** organise a variety of activities aimed at keeping the body and the mind fit and healthy.

### **WI Advisors**

- visit annual meetings when requested.



### **Subscriptions**

On joining a WI and then annually in April, you will pay your subscription to your WI Treasurer. The amount you pay to your Treasurer is divided three ways. Approximately 50% of the fee is kept by your own WI towards its running costs including speakers. 25% is paid to SWFWI towards its expenses, including the staff salaries. The remainder is paid to the NFWI which covers the cost of eight copies per year of 'WI Life' sent to each member, and the running of that tier of the organisation, campaign resources, national activities and national training for volunteers to help run WIs at a local level.

You can become a member of up to two WIs at the same time, this is called Dual Membership. As a Dual Member you only pay the NFWI and federation fee once when joining your primary WI. At your second WI you will pay the WI fee only.

Subscription costs are reviewed annually by NFWI and members are notified of the next year's subscription rate in the autumn.



Your WI subscription represents good value. The more you become involved, the greater your enjoyment and the better value your subscription becomes.



### **Your Membership Checklist**

As a WI member you should have received the following from your WI Secretary:



- WI Member Registration form
- General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) form
- Gift Aid form (optional)
- Information on how to pay your subscription to your WI
- Your WI programme

# It is essential you complete the WI registration form and the GDPR form.

Once you've received these and paid your subscription fees, your information will be added to the WI membership system (MCS) by your WI.

You will then receive your My WI login via email and your optional membership card will be available on My WI. The WI's quarterly magazine, WI Life will be delivered directly to your door.
