






WI Office Information

MCS: Membership Communication System

The MCS is an online system each WI uses to record their members' details. When a new member joins, her details must be added to the MCS to receive their welcome pack, My WI login and to be subscribed to WI Life.

We offer MCS training for all our Suffolk West WI reps. Whether you're a newbie or a veteran there's always new tricks to learn!

Don't just take our word for it, this is what Lynn Andrews had to say...

I've been Great Ashfield and Badwell Ash's MCS rep since 2016, so really I didn't need to go to a training session, did I? After all, I must know all there is to know by now. However it's always good to support anything that Suffolk West puts on, so in that spirit I went along.

Shows how much I know! It was an excellent presentation by Anne and Shirley and whilst I was reassured that most of what I was doing was OK, I learnt some really useful things.....

Did you know your web editor can't alter meeting details on your WI's web page? Only your MCS rep can do that.

Do you mark your members as paid? (I thought that was purely a Treasurer's job.) Go to 'Members', 'Active All', and at the end of the row is a box marked 'Select'. Tick it for each member that has paid. Yes OK, this is probably doubling up on whatever that mysterious system is the treasurer has, but this is the one that helps Rachel in the office, so well worth doing. Only your MCS rep can do that.

Did you know you can easily produce an excel or word report for e.g. your monthly attendance meeting? Take some of the load off your overworked secretary! Only your MCS rep can do that.




