

SUFFOLK HEDGEHOG HOSPITAL Our speaker was Sue Stubley from the Suffolk Hedgehog Hospital. Sue has been caring for sick and wounded hedgehogs for 14 years and is the founder of the Suffolk Hedgehog Hospital which

funded entirely by donations. The hospital offers help, medical care, food, and accommodation to between 2 to 15 rescued hogs a day. The aim is to release the animals back into the wild as soon as they are fit and well again. Hedgehogs are endangered for various reasons. Their natural habitat has been destroyed, they are susceptible to lung worm, which is carried by slugs and snails, and they are vulnerable to climate change which disrupts their hibernation pattern. Although hedgehogs can live for eight or nine years, they

rarely survive beyond eighteen months. Sue's talk was fascinating, and we all enjoyed meeting 'Greta'. one of her rescued hogs, as well as her dog 'Lottie' who definitely 'stole the show'!
